CRANSLONG sudden random change of tempo in sync

the musicians are in sync, the tempo suddenly changes rando calrision, the musicians are in sync.

Accrescence rhythmic patterns speed up to crescendo

a musical device, a passage, a development by the musicians of their patterns in intensity, which is product of their frequency and their amplitude. a "lite" neologism based on accelerando, crescendo, and also crescence (becoming).

Wabawaba rhythms fall apart into a pulsating bed

an increasure of tongue-lolling is enjoyed by all musicians as they project their minds into a "lazy feeling" as their rigorous striations "fall" into a "bed" of orgiastic slithering, jello-wrasling. wabawaba is thus pronounced in a lazy intonation.

SUCCO-inculcubi ornate melodies that continuously elaborate

baroque, succulent, little devils o' melody. a calculus (little stone) is embedded within buffalo wings, put there by a conscientious adult.

Griodus strange trickster figure who interrupts music

also a "lite" neologism based loosely on the African musicman/trixter "Griot" and the myth of Odysseus.

huap backwards singing

I said, "now if the piece is backwards then the word is too". This is the backword of "pauh", so it is pronounced breathing in. Practice breathing in during "h" and also ending with a suck-in "p" lip sound. These should actually be written "h-bar" as in an "h" with a bar in it (cf. quantum physics) and "p-bar", same deal.

Barberibus endless upward elevator

loosely sounding like- Barber shop, where those bearded go, the spyral symbol of said shop, and berberi spice sauce at the Ethiopian restaurant.

and now, the pieces:

- 1. s-cat: the ultra technique intro piece no singing, all rhythm
- 2. nodemesnes, in the following text speaks of "relabizzi" 1st piece within singing, circular structures
